We believe, in faith, that God is with us, even when we cannot sense God’s presence. That too, is worth rejoicing over.

Focusing on God’s love and not our fear or despair or pain will strengthen us as well. This is not to say we are denying the existence of our pain or discouragement, but that we recognize we always have a choice what we pay attention to: we can cling in faith to God’s presence and continuing love OR we can grasp ahold of fear and get “frozen” there eventually barely able to have any other response. When we cling to the Lord and

choose to rejoice in God's good and abiding love, eventually we will come through whatever difficulty and we will be renewed. When we are renewed in our spirit, then we can respond to God and others in a whole new way. We continue on the never ending cycle of being renewed, responding to God and others in faith, and rejoicing in the Lord through every phase of life. The Lord is near... rejoice! And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your heart and your mind in Christ Jesus.
